It all began in 1962, when Ms. Eunice Kennedy Shriver discovered there was a lack of organized athletic opportunities and events for children growing up with disabilities. It was this lack of opportunity and inclusion, as well as growing up with a sister with intellectual disabilities, that led Kennedy Shriver to start Camp Shriver, the first organized program for children with developmental and intellectual disabilities. This day camp began in the back yard of her very own Maryland farmhouse, and was immediately successful amongst the community. Several years later in 1968, with the help of her brother, President John F. Kennedy and the Kennedy Foundation's donations, Camp Shriver blossomed into what we know today as the Special Olympics.

For over 50 years, the Special Olympics has made it it's mission to create a global movement that breaks down barriers both on and off the field, while building up and empowering the millions of athletes across the globe who participate in their events every year. Special Olympics helps foster the foundations of education, health, and athletics, through the power of sport and teamwork. The athletic organization has transformed the world of sports as we know it today.

Now through July of 2019, Special Olympics New Jersey celebrates the 50th year anniversary of changing the game and promoting inclusion in the Garden State. In honor of its 50th year, ESPN and Special Olympics have teamed up on a year-long storytelling initiative to highlight inspirational and motivating "game changer" moments of inclusion and achievement in their athletes' lives.

DAY SUPPORT SERVICES UPDATES *Marisa Lione, Director of Programs*

The Day Habilitation Programs of Hudson Milestones continue to welcome new participants when openings become available and/or an opportunity for over enrollment occurs. Both the Jersey City Day Habilitation Program (JCDH) and Bayonne Day Habilitation (BDH) are currently filled to capacity. We look forward to the opportunity to welcome more clients with the eventual opening of the Monmouth Day Habilitation Program in 2020. We are happy to provide tours and meet & greets with prospective new participants. If for any reason we cannot immediately serve a prospective participant, we can add them to our waiting list.

The Fee-For-Service conversion is nearly complete in the day programs, and now more than 100 of the participants are part of the Supports Program. Our staff are participating in the last of the meetings, reviewing plans and providing important insight into the development of the Person-Centered Planning Tools (PCPTs). They are also working diligently to perfect the paperwork documenting our services. The billing for services rendered is submitted on a weekly basis and continues to be going well.



A recent DDD audit of the BDH Program provided positive feedback on our Daily Activity Logs being completed by staff. We are thrilled with this result and continue to offer ongoing training as needed to ensure all services are properly documented.

RESPITE UPDATE:

Great news from the Hudson Milestones Respite Program! The program has doubled in size in a matter of a few short months! We couldn't be more excited that we are providing more and more families with a muchneeded break while their family member enjoys recreation, socialization and increased community inclusion. If you or someone you know needs companionship and these wonderful services – give us a call. Our Respite clients are participating in lots of fun activities including the After-Hour Program, Weekend Respite Program activities and the annual Hudson Milestones Dinner Dance.
